All pieces are to be played without repeats, unless otherwise stated and will include manuals and pedals unless otherwise stated. Only ONE piece is to be played in each section except in the Championships. The organ installed at the venue is the only instrument being used for this category. Practice time may be arranged directly with the Hall Supervisor/Convenor at Pittwater House. Practice time prior to the competition is available from 3.30pm.

Please note: that due to the previously low number of entries we have decided to open the senior competition to all organ students regardless of age but it is restricted to those who will be students at the time of the competition

Entry Fee: \$10 - Time limit: 8 minutes

ROMANTIC/MODERN SECTION

Entry Fee: \$10 - Time limit: 8 minutes

O804 Junior (15 years and under) own choice (may be played on manuals only)

O805 Senior (Open Age) own choice

HYMN TUNE SECTION

Entry Fee: \$10 - Time limit: 4 minutes

Appropriate number of verses must be played with changes in registration and optional harmonising in final verse(s) and/or improvisations between verses.

O807 Junior (15 years and under) own choice of hymn tune.

O808 Senior (Open Age) own choice of hymn tune.



Did you know . . .? Origins of the Choir Organ

"After the Revolution staff was reduced considerably, as was the case with other Paris Churches, and choirs had to be backed by suitable accompaniment . . ."



"Still, a great organ was definitely built at Notre Dame in the 13th century . . . it was a modest 6-foot Montré organ with a single keyboard with 4 - 6 pipes per note. . . ."

This site is fantastic, with a picture gallery par excellence, a world-wide database of organs, info about organs in general, all kinds of pipes - some with sound archives, how an organ is built from start to finish, queer organ facades, hovering organs and yes, wait for it, a reversible organ!!

Did you know . . . Which organ has the largest number of 32' pipes - Melbourne Town Hall Organ comes in at 4th along with 3 others (6 stops), and Sydney Town Hall comes in 5th along with 6 others (5 stops).



The loudest organ stops - Guinness Book of Records says that the Convention Hall Organ in Atlanta City (USA) is the loudest - the Grand Ophicleide 16' -it boasts the wind pressure of 100 (Well, some others claim to be just as loud!)

The heaviest pipe is the Diaphone-Dulzian 64' coming in at 1,675kg. The second on the list is the Contra-Trombone 64' (precise weight unknown) at our very own Sydney Town Hall. Perhaps whilst cleaning, which is about to happen, they could pop it on a scale.





If you thought 6' at Notre Dame was a bit strange (Not really, 6' relates to the pitch of the biggest pipe in the rank, in this case a G and not C.) What about a $42\ 2/3$ '? The only complete sub-subcontra fifth in the whole world are to be found at USA, Atlantic City, Convention Hall: Diaphone-Dulzian $42\ 2/3$ ' (Ext. of 64'). This makes the Convention Hall organ the only one able to produce an acoustic 128' (64' + $42\ 2/3$ ' = 4 Hz difference tone on C).

What about the slowest piece of organ music . . .

The world's largest house organ . . . Santa?!
